But sadly, this is our reality this year – for we are living *(and I want to stress living)* in the midst of a pandemic that has claimed over 1.5 million lives so far worldwide.

Strangely, this reality seems to be a weird connection between the first hearers of the good news of the birth of Jesus and us. Fear! Fear and uncertainty quietly creep into our lives when we least expect, but this time of year, it cannot be hidden or covered up.

But we are not alone; from the very beginning of times we are told that fear was present... Fear entered into the Garden of Eden and seized Adam. 

We have resumed the 10 AM Zoom broadcast every Sunday and have the Worship Services uploaded to our website and YouTube channel by Saturday evening—thanks to Matt Khargie!

For the 2020 Advent Season, we have developed a **mid-week Devotional** to help nourish our faith – check your emails for links or visit our website.

Finally, we pray that you will be patient, continue to keep the faith (spread it when you can), keep a safe distance from others outside your household and keep healthy until we meet again.



There is a **Special Congregational Meeting** scheduled for Sunday, **December 20th** immediately following the 10 AM Zoom broadcast of Sunday Worship. All are invited to this meeting as we consider the 2021 Proposed Church Budget. Please contact the Church Office by December 13th to request a paper copy of the Proposed Budget – we can also email you a PDF version, if you prefer.

The COVID-19 pandemic forced us to suspend in-person worship for the majority of Sundays this year. We miss our Church traditions of gathering, singing and socializing as a family of God, but we stay apart now so that we can be together later. Though thankful for those who continue to give towards our ongoing ministries, we project a **40% short-fall** in our anticipated offering for 2020. But, there is still time remaining this year for you to makeup on your contributions.

Looking ahead to 2021, our synod Bishop Paul Egensteiner has renewed Pastor Dabee's part-time appointment as Pastor at St. James-St. Matthew's for another two years. We are thankful to God and pray that our Church's ministry continues to blossom and grow.
