Reality Check !

Greetings Church family,

When I first enrolled in seminary back in 2001, there were 238 congregations in the Metropolitan New York Synod. I was very proud to be a part of such a growing multicultural witness to the gospel in a one-of-kind metropolis.

At the Virtual Synod Assembly held Aug 20-21, it was reported that there were about 190 congregations that currently make up the Synod. So in 20 years, 40-plus houses of worship were closed, merged or simply ceased to exist. That is an average of 2 every year, and we know of 3 such congregations within the Southwest Queens Conference. This is an irreplaceable loss to many, including the communities served by these churches.

Our Church records show that in March 2015, the members of St. James-St. Matthew's voted to staying separate—not to merge with three sister congregations. While other Churches (St. Phillip's, St. Luke's and Christ Lutheran) voted to close and merge into a new ministry site, we voted 35-33 to remain a Church in South Ozone Park.

Over the last six years, a lot has happened, some members have left while others have joined—but the building is still standing; some members have died while others have been newly baptized into the faith—but we kept on gathering for worship, even in the midst of a pandemic.

However, the numbers are alarming – our average attendance has dropped by 70% and Offerings by 66%.

I know that this reality is partly due to the COVID-19 pandemic but I am more concerned about the shortage of volunteer leaders and worship assistants (ushers, assisting ministers and lectors). Worship is what makes us church and not having volunteers to assist in the process is unbecoming of a church – a called out community of believers.

It is nice to have a Church to call your own, but it takes work to keep one. In fact, the word "liturgy" when translated from the Greek literally means "work of the people – public work" and that is what we are called to do at St. James-St. Matthew's in order to continue being the Church in this community.

Come next year, we will mark 95 years of public witness as a congregation. Now, while this is commendable and worth celebrating, I want to invite you to envision the next 5 years perhaps 10 years – what will it look like? Let us look to the future where St. James-St. Matthew's Lutheran Church will be alive, for as the book of wisdom tells us "Where there is no vision, the people perish..." (Prov. 29:18)
