
## The Liturgical Church Year: Lent

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, which means "spring." There is a connection with the season of "lent" to the reality of the "lengthening" of the days coming out of the shorter days during winter.

The forty days for Christians represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry. See - Mark 1:13 He was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him. Matthew 4:2 He fasted forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was famished. Luke 4:2 where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing at all during those days, and when they were over, he was famished.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent was a time to prepare new converts for baptism. Today, Christians focus on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or take on something, e.g. volunteering and giving of themselves for others

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter" and the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.





